Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Bread and wine. But when we think about the Eucharist we are in the habit of thinking only of the bread, as on the last two Sundays (and also next Sunday). Today let's think about wine.

There are interesting parallels and connections and contrasts between wine and the Holy Spirit in the Scriptures and in Christian literature. Let's mention a few of them.

Psalm 103 speaks of "wine to cheer the heart." This is also what the Holy Spirit does for the human spirit. "Do not drug yourselves with wine, for this is simply dissipation," wrote St Paul, "but be filled with the Spirit" (Eph 5:18). After the Resurrection of Jesus the apostles appeared to be drunk: "Some people sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.' But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, 'Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning,'" and then he recited God's promise, "I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh" (Acts 2:13-17). Commenting on this, St Cyril of Jerusalem (c. 315 AD - 387) said it was not so surprising after all that those bystanders should mistake the wine of the Spirit for ordinary wine. In the desert, wrote Paul, the Jews drank from the rock but were unaware of the full meaning of that drink. "All drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was Christ" (1 Cor 10:4). Now at last in the Eucharist the full reality is abundantly present: the faithful can drink the "true spiritual drink" from the wounded side of Christ.

"The one Spirit was given to us all to drink" (1 Cor 12:13). "Each time you drink," wrote St Ambrose, "you become drunk with the Spirit. The one who drinks ordinary wine staggers, but the one who becomes drunk with the Spirit is rooted in Christ." "Oh, blessed drunkenness from the chalice of salvation," he wrote, "which lifts the sadness of a conscience weighed down by sin and pours in the joy of eternal life!" This joy, in the famous paradoxical phrase of St Gregory of Nyssa, is the "sober inebriation" that the Spirit causes in us.

There is a certain mystique about wine, probably because it is produced only in sunny countries. We in colder places can feel (with some reason) that some of that sunshine has been captured in wine. An Englishman, Tennyson, wrote about wines that "sucked the fire of some forgotten sun, / And kept it through a hundred years of gloom." Certainly there is a notable absence of joy in the faith of many Christians. Joy is one of the fruits of the Spirit, Paul said, and so central is it that he placed it right after love in his list: "Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control" (Gal 5:22).

Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity

**Priest:** Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

**All:** **For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever.**

**Priest:** Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever.

**Priest:** The Lord be with you.  
**All:** **And with your spirit.**

**Priest:** May the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of his Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

**All:** **Amen.**

**Priest:** And may the blessing of almighty God, the Father, and the Son, + and the Holy Spirit, come down on you and remain with you for ever.
