Twenty first Sunday in Ordinary Time Cycle C

I knew a gentle Indian nun who had lived a year in Europe and was beginning to get courage to comment on things. "Europeans are always asking Why?" she said, "and 'How much?' and 'What time is it?'" We want to quantify things; it's a way to feel in control. They are all good questions in themselves, but they are not the right questions in every situation. Jesus ignored the question "How many?" in this reading. He ignored a similar question in Matthew 24: about "when" the end will be.

We imagine the person with a question to be in a superior position, especially if he or she has a microphone in hand. We imagine them to be neutral, clear-headed, authoritative – almost like judges. And we imagine that we are morally obliged to answer every question. But a question can be just as confused and wrong-headed as a statement; it can be biased and belittling; it can express, while trying to conceal, a personal agenda; it can be trivial; it can be everything that a statement can be. In fact, even at its best, a question is just an ambiguous statement.

It is as necessary to pay attention to our questions as to our answers – especially in religious matters. "Who made you?" someone asked the little slave girl in Uncle Tom's Cabin. "Don't think nobody ever made me," she replied, "I s'pect I growed." Her answer was better than the question. The questioner's image of God was of a craftsman of some kind: someone who makes objects and puts them there. We always have some image of God; it helps to hold some ideas and experiences and feelings together. But we know that no image can do justice to God.

The trouble is when we have images that we are not conscious of having. Even very sophisticated people can be held captive by buried images of God. I once knew a moral theologian who had been a mechanical engineer before studying for the priesthood. His moral theology was a perfect piece of engineering: from an infinite tank grace flowed in to activate the four cardinal virtues, like pistons, which made the wheels of the moral life to turn...It is very seldom that you get a simple theologian. Instead you get a theologian-engineer, or a theologian-lawyer, or a theologian-journalist... What makes the difference is the question we ask, and the way we ask it. A loaded question gives you back only what you loaded it with.

Will only a few be saved? That is a question that a statistician would ask. The mind works comfortably when its object is 'out there', in the third person, so to speak. But Jesus' reply was in the second person: "Strive to enter by the narrow door...." We have a tendency to survey our faith as if it were a landscape that did not include ourselves. But a genuine spiritual question is always intensely practical and personal. "What good deed must I do to possess eternal life?" asked the young man; and then "What more do I need to do?" (Mt 19:16, 20). They were real questions, even though he didn't prove capable of acting on the answers to them. He had the grace to go away "sad"; he didn't go away like the Pharisees thinking he was better than other people. There was hope for him. There is always hope for an honest person looking for the right way.

May he make of us an eternal offering to you, so that we may obtain an inheritance with your elect, especially with the most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with blessed Joseph, her spouse, with your blessed Apostles and glorious Martyrs with Saint Patrick and with all the Saints, on whose constant intercession in your presence we rely for unflinching help.

## Message from the Administrator

"It's not what you know, it's who you know", or so we say in Ireland (and probably in many other countries too). There might have been the most exhaustive process involved in the hiring of a new employee, which is open and transparent to the ultimate degree, yet ultimately personal knowledge still seems to play a part in everything. That person's grandfather was from the same place as me, or his wife works with my wife, and so this person rather than that person gets the job.

Priests are familiar with the way we are informally vetted when first we arrive in a parish. Parishioners are interested in where we were before, where we are from, who our people are – to trace links, find out information, to see what the future holds for us in the parish. Degrees and pastoral experience fade away before personal knowledge: What we know never counts as much as who we know – or who knows us!

It seems people during the Lord's time traded in that sort of information also. Personal knowledge of an individual seemingly counted as most significant, then as now. This could explain why the Lord addressed certain lines to them in the Gospel this weekend "You will find yourself saying: We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our street", but He will reply, "I do not know where you come from".

Time and again the Lord explains that it's not who your people are that counts, or what family claim you, or where your native place is. It's what your own life says that matters: Your faith, your love, your justice, your truth.

Lord, reserve a place in Your kingdom for us, and give us the grace we need to deserve the place you keep for us.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR BOOKING BAPTISMS

Beginning in October 2022, all parents and godparents will be asked to participate in a short one evening course to prepare them for the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism. It will take place in Newry Parish Centre and will be led by the Baptism Team. The first course will take place in the first week of September and every month thereafter.

This course is for all parishioners, including those who wish to have their child baptised outside Newry Parish. Once you have completed the short one evening course, the date for your child's baptism will be confirmed. The booking form for the course will be available from Newry Parish Office.

All babies must be registered for baptism in the Cathedral Parish Office, Hill Street, Newry, not in St. Catherine's. The reason is that the official baptismal register is kept only in the Cathedral Parish Office.

When a baby is to be baptised, please call at the Cathedral Parish Office and the Church in which the baby is to be baptised will be recorded. You will receive a card in the Cathedral Parish Office which you must complete and return to the Cathedral Parish Office, not St. Catherine's. The details on this card will be recorded in the official register once the baptism has taken place. The Cathedral Parish Office will inform St. Catherine's, by e-mail, of baptisms booked to take place in their Church.
