Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God

“Who do people say I am?” Jesus once asked; and then “Who do you say I am?” (Mt 16:15). It is a question that never goes away, and every believer faces it again and again. You can be quite clear in your mind about the Church’s answer to the question, but every believer has to experience the force of the question addressed to him or herself. “Who do you say I am?” In a sense it cannot be fully answered with words but only with one’s life. I could have the right formulation, but it has little significance if my life contradicts it or ignores it.

Through the centuries every possible answer has been given. Followers of Nestorius, the 5th-century archbishop of Constantinople said that Christ was two persons – the man Jesus and the divine Son of God. This view was rejected at the Council of Ephesus (431 AD), which insisted that Jesus was one person with two natures, divine and human. The most emphatic way they could say this was to affirm that Mary was not just the mother of the man Jesus, but that she was the mother of God. This was to say that Christ was one person, not two. The word used of Mary was ‘Theotokos’ (Greek for ‘God-bearer’). The Council of Chalcedon (451 AD) continued the use of this term, and it has become orthodox Christian teaching. Note that it is more a statement about Christ than about Mary – or rather, equally so. Icons of the ‘Theotokos’ are common now in the West.

In a sense, when a child is born a mother is born. When a child is born, its mother begins to be a mother. Even if she was already mother to other children this new child makes her a new mother; a new chapter in her mothering begins. In the birth of the Son of God, Mary begins to be the Mother of God. When a Child is born, a Mother is born.

MESSAGE FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

As a new calendar year begins, with echoes of 'ringing out the old and ringing in the new' fresh in our consciousness today, it may seem that our liturgical calendar is not of sync with the prevailing mood. Today's readings invite us to keep Christmas in mind, with a focus on Mary, Mother of God, whose 'fiat' and faith will forever be a vital part of the Christmas story. We are still in the Christmas season.

If we link the first reading and the Gospel, the theme of blessing is very evident. Blessings are part of everyday life. Parents bless their children, neighbour blesses neighbour, priest blesses the sick and dying, farmers bless their crops and livestock, travellers pray God's blessing on their journey. To bless is to acknowledge gifts received, to share one's own experience of blessing, to open doors to gratitude.

The Gospel this weekend invites us to meet the shepherds, humble visitors from hills, not even given names in the biblical text. They are God's chosen messengers to Mary, confirming for her what she has already heard at the Annunciation about the identity of her child. Mary is blessed by this unusual, nocturnal visit by strangers, and she treasures the message, 'pondering it in her heart.' The shepherds, too, are blessed by the experience and they go back 'glorifying and praising God'. A blessing shared transforms both messenger and recipient.

Moses, who had seen God 'face to face' and been transformed by that experience, wants that blessing shared among his descendants. He wants others to be blessed just as he has been blessed: 'May the Lord make his face to shine on you and give you peace!' This theme of blessing is echoed in the opening lines of the psalm this weekend: 'O God be gracious and bless us and let your face shed its light upon us.' This could be our prayer today, as we welcome another New Year.

On behalf of Archbishop Eamon Martin, Fr. Alphonsus, Fr. Callum, Fr. Wojciech, Deacon Carlos, the Staff of the Parish Office and me, I wish all our parishioners in Newry & Saval a peace-filled New Year. May we enrich each other by sharing our faith with each other.

We request that you leave your Anniversary in as early as possible to avoid disappointment.

You are aware of the cost of heating & lighting the three churches in the parish is ever increasing. Boxes of envelopes are still available from the parish office as are standing order forms. We also have a cashless point in the Cathedral for those who wish to use this facility. For the use of one of the parish churches at other times we need to look at ways to finance such events, so that those celebrations are comfortable whilst parishioners are in church. Your suggestions are always very welcome by email, telephone or by letter.

We hope to get off to a new start in 2023, so we would welcome your suggestions as soon as possible.
