Look, we pray, upon the oblation of your Church and, recognising the sacrificial Victim by whose death you willed to reconcile us to yourself, grant that we, who are nourished by the Body and Blood of your Son and filled with his Holy Spirit, may become one body, one spirit in Christ.

May he make of us an eternal offering to you, so that we may obtain an inheritance with your elect, especially with the most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with blessed Joseph, her spouse, with your blessed Apostles and glorious Martyrs with Saint Patrick and with all the Saints, on whose constant intercession in your presence we rely for unfailing help.

May this Sacrifice of our reconciliation, we pray, O Lord, advance the peace and salvation of all the world. Be pleased to confirm in faith and charity your pilgrim Church on earth, with your servant Francis our Pope and N our Bishop, the Order of Bishops, all the clergy, and the entire people you have gained for your own.

Listen graciously to the prayers of this family, whom you have summoned before you: in your compassion, O merciful Father, gather to yourself all your children scattered throughout the world. St. Joseph's Conference SVP

St. Joseph's Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul has just ended its Winter quarter which takes in Christmas and is usually the busiest time of the year for the Conference.

In the three months of December, January & February the Conference received 417 applications for assistance. In addition Conference members distributed toys to 381 children.

The Annual Christmas Collection which this year raised £23,067.71 (including £7,419 from the Church door Collection and the balance from donations) meant that the Conference was able to respond generously to those requests for assistance. The Conference wishes to express its deep appreciation to our fellow parishioners who financially support our work and without which we could not continue in our work.

In recent months parishioners will have become aware of the growing problem of homelessness in Newry and some have approached Conference members about what can be done. The Conference although not a charity dealing specifically with the complex issues of homelessness has committed considerable resources to the Drop – In Centre above our shop in Mill Street. Here, meals are provided Monday – Saturday and the Drop – In Centre is open to all, not just the homeless. It provides warm and welcoming place in the town centre and on average 30 people a day are calling to the Centre.

The Conference is now considering opening the Drop – In Centre on Sunday for two hours on a trial basis to provided basic food for those most in need. This will take considerable commitment and if you might be interested in giving two hours on a Sunday to assist in the Drop – In Centre, please contact our shop in Mill Street and leave your name and contact details and a Conference member will be in touch. If we all contribute a little it can change a lot!
